

## Lord's Supper Teaching Assignment

**Directions:** You will be divided into 2 groups. One of the groups will prepare and present a lesson to the entire class and Pastor Damian during which they will teach the essentials of The Lord's Supper. The remaining group will prepare and present a lesson that will teach the essentials of Holy Baptism to the same audience.

The following are the requirements for the presentations:

- 1) You may work only with your group members and other adult advisers (Pastor Damian, Miss. Denise, Mrs. Gray, your parents, etc.)
- 2) Your presentation may last no longer than 50 minutes and must last at least 30 minutes.
- 3) Your presentation must include answers to the questions (but may be wider in scope):
  - A) What is the definition of a sacrament?
  - B) Who is worthy to participate in the sacrament of The Lord's Supper? What happens if a person is unworthy and still participates?
  - C) What Bible verses teach about The Lord's Supper? (at least 5 different verses)
  - D) What are the physical elements in The Lord's Supper?
  - E) What are the effects of The Lord's Supper on the believer? On the unbeliever?
  - F) What does Luther's Small Catechism say about The Lord's Supper?
  - G) How do we celebrate The Lord's Supper at Trinity?
  - H) What does the Roman Catholic Church teach about The Lord's Supper?
  - I) What does the Southern Baptist Church teach about The Lord's Supper?
  - J) Have all of the members of your group been baptized? When? Where? By whom?
  - K) Who can publicly administer The Lord's Supper on a regular basis?
  - L) Why do we celebrate The Lord's Supper? Who commanded it? How often should someone receive the Lord's supper?
  - M) What other names are used for The Lord's Supper?
  - N) Is the Lord's Supper magic? That is, does it work simply because we say some special words and do some special actions? Why or why not?
- 4) The presentation may **NOT** simply be a list of answers to the above questions. Rather, it is to integrate the above questions into the overall teaching time. This is **your** chance to be the teacher. Show us what you can do!
- 5) You are encouraged to use many different ways to communicate your points. These may include: overheads, power point presentations, video, handouts, games, lecture, etc. In fact, you are required to use at least 3 visual aids.
- 6) Excellent resources to use in your preparation include: Luther's Small Catechism, The Bible, The Lutheran Service book (our hymnal), the website of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod ([www.lcms.org](http://www.lcms.org)) (with your parents' permission), etc.
